Dear Ones,

In this time when many are frightened by the COVID-19 virus, it is comforting to remember that our fate is in the hands of a loving God. An acquaintance came up with the acronym, CORONA (Christ, Only, Rules Over Natural Adversity) to remind us of God’s loving sovereignty. We recognize the power of worship to provide hope, comfort, and joy in the midst of chaos and anxiety. Therefore, we will be continuing our worship service at its regular time. However, we also want to do everything we can to prevent the spread of disease, so we are making some changes.

- **First, if you or anyone in your household is not feeling well, please do not come to church;** or if you feel vulnerable or uncomfortable in a gathering of a number of people. Please e-mail the church office (rioranchoumc@gmail.com) so our prayer team can include you in our prayers.
- **Second, we will be wiping down the pews for cleanliness. However, please sit with your family at least six feet away from others.** Infected people can cough or sneeze and generate respiratory droplets, which then land on nearby surfaces. These droplets do not travel more than six feet unless the person coughs or sneezes at you.
- **Third, do not touch door handles or your face unnecessarily. Wash your hands frequently with soap and water or hand sanitizer.** People with the viruses on their hands can deposit the viruses onto a door handle when they open the door. These viruses can stay alive on surfaces for at least several hours, so people who touch a surface with the viruses on it and then touch their nose or eyes can become infected.
- **Fourth, Children’s Sunday school is cancelled until further notice.** Younger children are constantly touching each other, and our teachers can’t control that. If they spread infection among themselves, they can bring it home to their parents and grandparents. We also don’t want to risk infecting their teachers.
- **Fifth, our music teams will be on hiatus until further notice.** Singing generates respiratory droplets and having the choir sing in close together rows creates a medium-to-risk of transmission. It is especially important to protect our senior choir members since the infection is more severe among seniors.
- **Sixth, small groups will be suspended until further notice, including Wednesday Night Out.**

On behalf of the Board of Directors of Storehouse West, we thank you and your congregation for your very generous gifts and donations in 2019 for a total of:

\$375.15 as part of \$2,896.48 received from area churches

and

1401 pounds of food as part of 16,253 pounds of food from 17 area churches

In the calendar year 2019 we distributed over 395,000 quality meals to almost 6,800 households representing 17,993 individuals. This is a 6% increase over 2018 totals. Our distribution includes 5,194 seniors and 5,029 children. Food was delivered to schools, senior living facilities, senior centers, and senior citizens living on pueblos. Without your support, and that of others, many of our fellow citizens who are food-insecure would not have had a reliable food source; food security is a basic foundation for daily work and school success.

CORONAVIRUS AND YOUR CHURCH

At the time of this article, we really have no idea if coronavirus will become a pandemic or if we have it under control. Though I tend to be optimistic about it, there are certainly perspectives on both sides of this issue.

You who are leaders in churches, though, need to begin thinking about how your church should respond right now rather than later. By the way, I am grateful to the community of [Church Answers](#). Many in our community are having very helpful conversations about this issue even as I write this article.

Though my suggestions are not comprehensive, I do think they provide solid guidelines to follow at this very moment.

Focus on prayer instead of panic. Remind your congregation that God is in control. Encourage them to pray for the cessation of the disease. Ask them to pray for the victims and their families. Encourage them to pray for the gospel to go forth boldly in the midst of this trial.

Develop a communication plan. For example, if someone in your church or community is stricken with coronavirus, be prepared to respond. Will you have services or not? If you do not have services, how long will this period be? How can people remain connected to your church?

Be prepared to offer digital worship services and Bible studies. If your church does not offer the streaming of services on the church website, Facebook live, or some other means, now is the time to move in that direction. Make certain you can have digital services even if you can't gather for a season.

Aggressively encourage people to use digital giving. If you can't gather and pass the offering plate or bucket, you need to be prepared to offer mechanisms for your members to give. You should be making this move regardless of coronavirus. It certainly helps giving when attendance is lower.

Develop a plan to help church members and community members. If the situation does worsen, there will be people in your area in need of help and in need of basic supplies. How will your church respond?

Consider current church practices that might be harmful for spreading coronavirus or other diseases. Though my bias against it is obvious, now is the time to consider bringing the traditional "meet and greet" to an end. In some of your churches, you might consider other changes. I was in a church a few years ago that shared a common cup. No way.

I remain more hopeful than panicked about coronavirus. Still, there is no reason for churches to be unprepared. Prepare for the worst and pray for the best.
