# Fund Raiser Credit

Each time a youth works a fund-raising event, they earn money that can be used to help pay for **camp**, **retreats**, **and mission trips**. Hours are tracked and based on the profit from the event each youth who worked will earn a percentage. To earn credit, youth must actively participate in the fund raiser, including set-up, and clean-up. (Adults can earn credit for their youth also!)

During youth group in the fall, we discussed inviting our friends to youth. group. The youth asked that we have a different event each week for at least a month. We are doing that starting January 19<sup>th</sup>! Check out the last page for details!

# **Destination** Unknown...

After Youth Led Worship on Sunday, March  $1^{st}$ , instead of our regular youth group time, we will have a "Destination Unknown" event. Plans are still being finalized, but the tentative plan is to meet at RRUMC at 1 PM to travel to our destination. We should return around 5 PM. The scripture for this event is John (4:33-51) (ERV):

God's bread is the one who comes down from heaven and gives life to the world." The people said, "Sir, from now on give us bread like that." Then Jesus said, "I am the bread that gives life. No one who comes to me will ever be hungry. No one who believes in me will ever be thirsty. I told you before that you have seen me, and still you don't believe. The Father gives me my people. Every one of them will come to me. I will always accept them. I came down from heaven to do what God wants, not what I want. I must not lose anyone God has given me. But I must raise them up on the last day. This is what the one who sent me wants me to do. Everyone who sees the Son and believes in him has eternal life. I will raise them up on the last day. This is what my Father wants." Some Jews began to complain about Jesus because he said, "I am the bread that comes down from heaven." They said, "This is Jesus. We know his father and mother. He is only Joseph's son. How can he say, 'I came down from heaven'?" But Jesus said, "Stop complaining to each other. The Father is the one who sent me, and he is the one who brings people to me. I will raise them up on the last day. Anyone the Father does not bring to me cannot come to me. It is written in the prophets: 'God will teach them all.' People listen to the Father and learn from him. They are the ones who come to me. I don't mean that there is anyone who has seen the Father. The only one who has ever seen the Father is the one who came from God. He has seen the Father. "I can assure you that anyone who believes has eternal life. I am the bread that gives life. Your ancestors ate the manna God gave them in the desert, but it didn't keep them from dying. Here is the bread that comes down from heaven. Whoever eats this bread will never die. I am the living bread that came down from heaven. Whoever eats this bread will live forever. This bread is my body. I will give my body so that the people in the world can have life."
